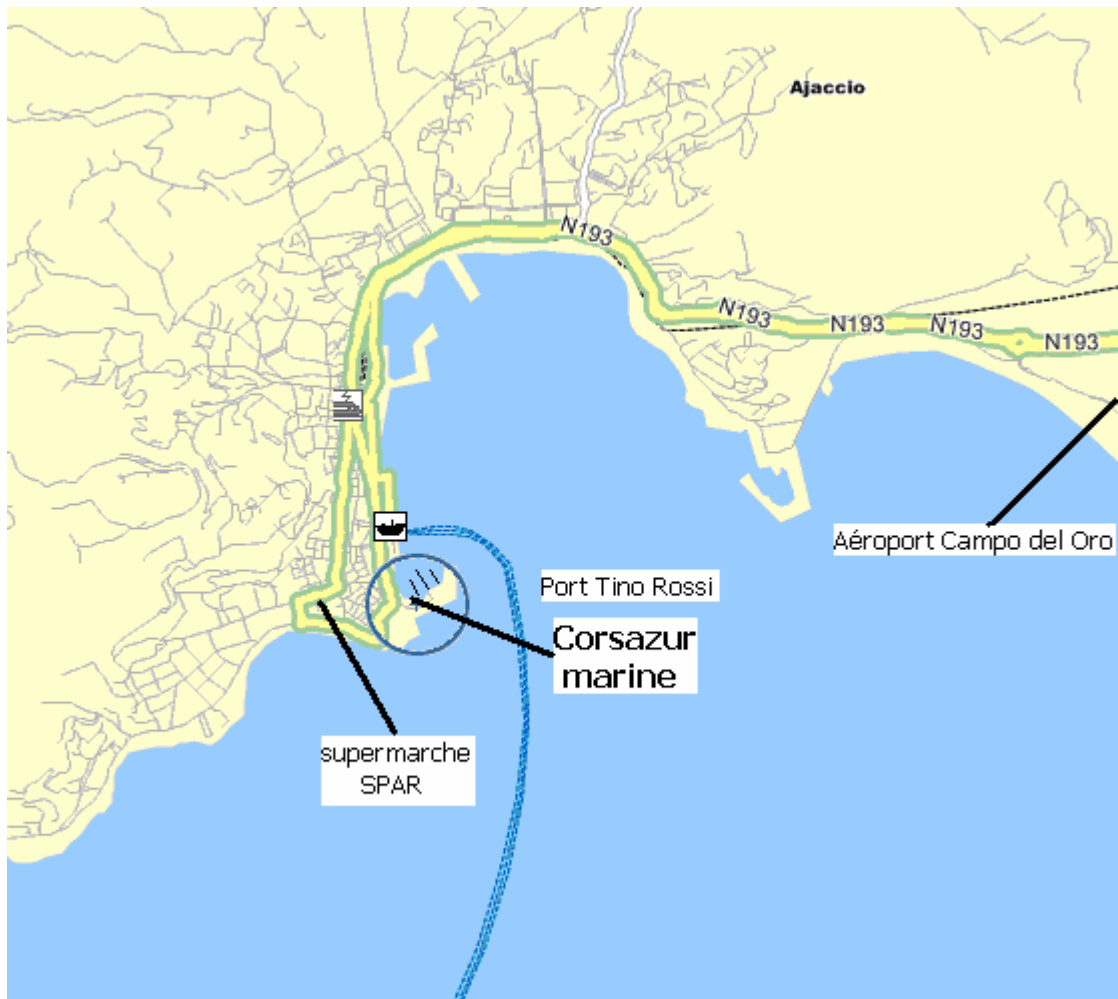

# HOW TO GET TO AJACCIO

## BY PLANE

### FROM THE AIRPORT TO THE BASE

Distance : 8 km

*Attention ! CORSAZUR MARINE does not automatically organise transports from the airport.*

### TAXIS

This is the easiest solution

Takes 30 min and costs approximately 23 €

No reservations needed.

### BUS

Every 20 mn (ligne N °1), cost 4 €,

Takes 40 mn.

Arrives in town at "Cours Napoléon"

Which is 900 m from the base.

### MINIBUS OR BUS FOR GROUPS

Corsazur Marine can organise a minibus or a bus for groups coming to the base (single trips **need reservations** made several days before) 5€ per person from 4 persons upward.

### HIRE CARS

All the main rental agencies are at the airports and main towns.

## BY ROAD

On arrival in Ajaccio, follow the seafront. Go past the commercial harbour until the Citadelle. The base is located in the Tino Rossi Harbour, just by the Citadelle.

## BY FERRY

### With your own car :

On leaving the ferry, you are 300m from the Tino Rossi harbour located south of the commercial harbour below the Citadelle.

Our offices are on the harbour located on the upper floor. You may park your car free for unloading. Long term parking facilities in town.

Corsazur Marine is situated in the Tino Rossi Harbour in the heart of the old town. Ajaccio, the imperial city, proudly guards traces of its illustrious past. Birthplace of Napoleon Bonaparte, in 1769, Ajaccio maintains an important historical heritage. The animated night life, small local restaurants and fine sandy beaches provide an agreeable start to your holiday.

### SHOPPING

### HARBOUR MASTER- SHOWER FACILITIES

### FUEL

The fuel tanks are full at the start of your cruise. Please remember to fill up before giving the boat back (otherwise a standard charge of 40€ will be made for refuelling).

### ELECTRICITY

The Corsazur Marine pontoon is equipped with 220V. The majority of our boats are equipped with an extension lead , a battery charger and 220V plugs. There is also an adaptor plug which allows you to plug into most of the local marinas. There is also a 12V cigar plug on most of our boats.

### ICE

The Corsazur Marine's boat are equipped with 12V refrigerators or Frigoboat. You can also buy ice from the Bar de la Jetee, the local food shop and the fuelling station

# YOUR CRUISE

## DEPARTURE

### **EMBARKATION: between 15h - 17 h**

**Please let us know your arrival time, this enables us to prepare the boats !**

This is the time at which your boat is ready. The paperwork and all navigational briefings are done earlier at the reception.

### **ON YOUR ARRIVAL**

After checking in at the reception, depending on the time, you can visit the town or do your shopping.

*Your luggage may be left at the reception*

### **LATE ARRIVAL (please advise !)**

The base staff are there until 20h.

After this time you will find on the noticeboard in front of the office a message showing the location of your boat.

The boat will be open and signposted with your name. All equipment will be functional for your night aboard. The staff will be at the base from 8h30 the following morning to do the check – in.

### **FORMALITIES /DEPOSIT**

The amount of the deposit depends on the type of boat.

After payment of the deposit the boat's documents with the log book and an inventory will be given to you.

- If you participate in a regatta the deposit will be doubled.

### **FLIGHT CONFIRMATION**

Our receptionist will be at your service for all information and can also help resolve any difficulties concerning flights, hotels or return transfers.

### **CRUISING INSTRUCTIONS**

You are invited to a chart briefing where you will receive recommendations (using the relevant charts) concerning anchorages and cruise itineraries.

You will also receive the 24 hours weather prevision with the days report.

The weather prevision is always available at the harbour masters office.

### **INVENTORY AND BOARDING**

Where possible we request that you do not put your luggage on board before the inventory has been done.

It is also preferable that only a small number of crew attend the technical explanations.

*You must check the boats equipment yourself, with the help of the inventory.* This will help you to memorise the place of each item.

One of our staff will come and help you in case of difficulties and/ or replace missing items.

### **BASIC PROVISIONS**

You will find aboard some basic provisions: toilet paper, paper towels, matches, sponge and one garbage bag.

### **LAUNDRY**

The Corsazur boats come equipped with pillows and blankets.

Laundry is an optional extra to be paid at the base ( reservation required at least ten days before departure) : price 19€ per person.

Laundry kit includes : 1 pillow case ; 1 bath towel ; 1 small towel ; 2 sheets ; per person and includes mask flippers and tuba.

Laundry and diving kit available at the office.

### **TECHNICAL BRIEFING**

The briefing is done by a technician. A full explanation is given of on how to use the motor, fridge, navigational instruments. Any queries concerning the inventory will be dealt with at this time.

## DURING YOUR CRUISE

### **BREAKDOWNS AND HELP**

If you encounter any technical difficulties that you can not resolve, please do not hesitate to contact the Corsazur Marine team. All will be arranged to help you as soon as possible. The mobile phone line is : 06 80 47 28 30. In case of absence always leave a message.

### **LOG BOOK**

French law and the insurance company requires that this must be kept up to date. In the case of any accidents you will be required to produce it. We are obliged to recuperate the log book at the end of your cruise. If you wish to have a copy the base will provide one.

### **IN THE CASE OF AN ACCIDENT OR DAMAGE**

All damage must be reported to Corsazur Marine so as to warn the insurance and take the necessary measures. A full report must be done by the captain aboard.

### **OBLIGATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHARTERER**

According to the terms of the contract signed by the charterer, we remind you that the charterer:

- assumes the legal and statutory obligations of the person responsible onboard.
- certifies that he or she has the ability to control or to keep the chartered boat in control.

Should you wish to refresh your sailing abilities, we advise you to hire a skipper for a week.

## YOUR RETURN

### **RETURN TIME : 17 HR**

It is imperative that the boat should returned at this time, ready for the check out.

### **THE CHECK OUT**

The return inventory will be checked against the original. A detailed technical checking will be done of the bilges, keel bolts, silent block, shaft propellor and the hull. An underwater check is also made to make sure that the boat has not been grounded.

### **RETURN CONDITION OF BOAT**

The boat must be in good order. The equipment must clean and put away in its original place.

We would request that you remove from the boat any items not on the inventory example: garbage, food etc. All luggage and personal items ready to be disembarked.

The inflatable dinghy must be inflated and on deck. Therefore it is preferable that the boat should be back in the harbour mid afternoon to be able to do all the above.

### **COMPLAINTS**

If during your cruise, a mechanical problem or any other difficulty arose, please inform the base manager.

### **Attention:**

**Please leave the boat at 08hrs as agreed in your contract.**

### HAZARDS

**We draw your attention to the two most frequent accidents in our area : grounding and rope in the propellor.**

- **Grounding** : Unfortunately this accident often causes enormous damage : broken hull and internal structures, risk of water coming in, hospitalisation of crew members and halt to cruise. The risk of grounding is considerably increased by the beauty of the area, the absence of tides and the rugged coastline which can make one forget elementary navigation rules. Read very carefully and regularly all charts, coastal guides and nautical instructions. Permanent vigilance and constant care is absolutely necessary. The electronic instruments (depth control, GPS) are only aids and do not replace continual evaluation of the captain.

**Be even more careful in Corsica. The coast is treacherous and countless reefs are just under the surface all along the coastline. You should be aware that statistically accidents are ten times more numerous here than in other areas.**

**Rope in the propellor:** Here as well damage can be considerable : bending of the propellor shaft, saildrive, twisting or breakage of engine parts, joints which could lead to important damage to hull leading to eventual sinking of boat.

Before starting the engine always check that no rope, halyard, sheet, fishing net or fishing line dangles in water. While cruising with the engine if it stops suddenly, before restarting always check that there is nothing tangled in the propellor (98%) and check that no water has come in through the joints.

### HARBOURS and MARINAS

It is not possible to reserves places in Corsica.

Single night berths available. Check with the VHF on Canal 9. One night berth for a 12m boat : from 24 à 60 Euro depending on the season and the marina.

### TIDES

In the western Mediterranean, the tide is very slight (30 to 60 cm depending on the area) the difference of the levels is also dependant on atmospheric conditions and dominant winds.

### BUOYING

In all European waters, the International A system is used and not the B system that is used in American and Caribbean waters.

**Leaving the harbour**, red beacons will be on Starboard and green beacons on Port (the opposite to the B system). You will also find yellow and black beacons called Cardinals that don't exist in the B system.

Please consult the guide, Livre de Bord Bloc Marine, pages 196 and 197. Don't hesitate to question our base manager if you have any doubts.

### RESTRICTED SAILING AREAS IN CORSICA

There are several areas in Corsica which are covered by special rules. You will find details in the guides or nautical instruction booklet aboard.

The Scandola and Lavezzi Island reserves are part of these special areas. Fishing is forbidden. Anchorage tolerated only during the daytime.

### ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES

#### **GASOIL**

Please take care when filled the boat up. Pay constant attention during the fuelling, so as to avoid any spillage.

#### **Used Oil**

Normally you do not need to changer the engine oil, Corsazur Marine does this regularly except in the case of a long term rental where the motor is used more than 100 hours. In this case make sure that you have an empty 5 liter used oil can before starting the oil change. Never throw old oil overboard or in drains. More harbours or marinas have used oil containers.

#### **POSIDONIES ALGAES**

In the whole of the Mediterranean these algae's are in danger. Be careful not to anchor in these areas as the anchor pull up the algae : fish use them to reproduce. It takes more than 100 years to regenerate these fields of algae.

#### **RUBBISH**

Only completely bio-degradable items can be thrown into the sea, although obviously not close to shore. Everything else must be stored aboard and thrown away in the large plastic containers which can be found in marinas or near villages. Please avoid disposing rubbish in beach containers which are not designed for large quantities.

# "CORSIKA CRUISES"

## EXAMPLE 1 WEEK NORTHERN CRUISE

### Day 1: Ajaccio – Golfe d’Ajaccio 8 MN

After visiting the old part of Ajaccio town head off across the Gulf of Ajaccio to either the anchorage in l’anse de Santa Barba , Isolella or the anchorage of Isola Piana in Portigliolo bay.



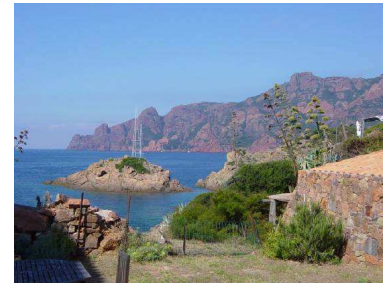
### Day 2: Golfe d’Ajaccio - Anse de Ficajola 30 MN.

Leave the Gulf of Ajaccio via the Sanguinaires. Following the coast you will come across Capu di Feno, the Gulf of Lava, the large Gulf of Sagone then the bay of Arone (a large bay boarded by a wonderful fine sandy beach).The passage past the Cap Rosso is impressive, its Genoese tower perched 340m above the sea. Navigation in the Porto Gulf is best at sunset (Calanches de Piana). Overnight anchorage in the Ficajola bay..

### Day 3 : Anse de Ficajola - Galeria 20 MN.

Wonderful sailing in the natural reserve of Scandola.

Anchorage in the Elbo bay with its cliffs of red porphyre and nearby mountains. Located in the natural reserve overnight anchorages are not allowed therefore raise anchor and head for Galeria.



### Day 4: Galeria - Calvi 20 MN.



The distance is short but it is important not arrive too late at Calvi as berths are in short supply. Organised anchorages on mooring buoys are allowed in front of the Calvi beach but this means using the dinghy to get to town

Evening spent around the harbour and a visit to the Citadelle with its pink roofs.

### Day 5 : Calvi – Girolata 30 NM

Difficult to get bored with the magnificent scenery in the Scandola natural reserve., not of course forgetting the narrow passage through l’Ile de Gargalo and the coast – crew member looking out for reefs from the bow. You need to calculate your cruise to pass the Cap Muchillina making the most of the afternoon sun which highlights the wonderful red cliffs which lead you into the gulf of Girolata.



### Day 6 : Girolata – Cargèse 20NM

The furthest trip from the impressive coastline takes you directly to Cargese, sheltering beneath its twin churches. Well worth the climb to the village, its restaurants and of course the churches.

### Day 7 : Cargese - Ajaccio 20 NM

Returning to the Imperial city passing the Sanguinaire islands (lunchtime anchorage) before being carried by the wind back to Ajaccio.



**Day 1: Ajaccio – Golfe d’Ajaccio 8 MN**

After visiting the old part of Ajaccio town head off across the Gulf of Ajaccio to either the anchorage in l’anse de Santa Barba, Isolella or the anchorage of Isola Piana in Portigliolo bay.



**Day 2: Ajaccio – Cala di Conca 25 MN**

Leave early for days sailing in the Gulf of Valinco. You can drop anchor in the Bay of Cupabia; don’t spend too much time as Cap Senetosa deserves a good afternoon. Choose your anchorage, I like the Conca beach with its turtle shaped rock.

**Day 3: Cala di Conca - Bonifacio 30 MN**

A long sail at certain distance away from a coastline made up of creeks and rocky headlands. Great care must be taken near the ‘ Moines reefs’ Spent the night in Bonifacio marina at the end of its long inlet bordered by its high cliffs. The old town well worth an evenings visit.



**Day 4: Bonifacio - Iles Lavezzi**

Navigation in the famous Straits of Bonifacio, a swimming lunch on l’île Lavezzi. Anchor at Cala Lazarina notorious since the sinking of the Sémillante, then return for the night at Bonifacio sheltered by the Citadel’s ramparts.



**Day 5 : Bonifacio - Tizzano**

Making way towards the north, make a short stay in cala di

Roccapina : A unique site with its chaotic granite boulders. This is a fair weather anchorage, drop anchor anywhere under the « lion » at the end of the bay or along the northern edge just before Cap Murtoli with its lovely fine sandy beach .

Dine at Tizzano (in the fish restaurant just behind the jetty). Anchor in front of the village without blocking the entrance channel. Do not try to enter the bay the depth does not exceed 1m.



**Day 6 : Tizzano - Porto Pollo**

Go around the Cap Senatosa (beware the reefs go a long way from shore) heading towards Campo Moro, a pretty little bay watched over by one of the most beautiful Génoise tower in Corsica, must be visited. The view of the gulf of Valinco is marvellous however very well known and you will not be the only ones here.

Anchor to the west of the bay under the tower. For the night anchorage cross the gulf to anchor in front of Porto

Pollo which is better protected. You are near to the famous Filitosa archeological site. Can be visited by taxi.



**Day 7 : Porto Pollo - Ajaccio 22 NM**

Lunch at the foot of Cap Muro in l’Anse de Cacao lost in the middle of nature.

Return towards the imperial city of Ajaccio carried by the breeze to the end of the gulf.
